




Aerial view illustrating concept of colonnade walkway

Taking our Past into our Future

From St Edward the Confessor - to Charles 111

- All Hallows - A Saxon church originally in the City of London at Lombard Street
- Rebuilt by the Normans
- Rebuilt by Sir Christopher Wren after The Great Fire of London
- Due for demolition in 1938. Saved by a public campaign. London was growing. What could be saved was dismantled & moved West.
- All Hallows Church rebuilt in Twickenham
- A special service opened All Hallows to the local community (09 Nov 1940). Anti Air Craft guns could be heard in the distance. It was the height of The Blitz. All Hallows had arrived
- We look to our future, with prayer and confidence, that we might strengthen our role, within the local community
